Indianapolis Eastside City-County Councilors Blake Johnson and Hornet Alumni Susie Cordi '76 were proud to recognize the **TC Howe Middle School Basketball Team** with a Special Resolution on May 21, 2018. The T.C. Howe Lady Hornets team secured the 2018 City Championship win on March 10, 2018. This is the first time in T.C. Howe history that our middle school girls secured a basketball championship. The team was led by their coach Christian Cunningham. The team enjoyed a 13-1 season.


Scholarship Committee





HORNET PROFILE

Chuck (Bud) McFall



Chuck (Bud) McFall, a 1959 graduate of Howe High School is currently president and CEO of Chuck McFall & Co., a marketing consulting firm in Minneapolis, Minnesota that helps Fortune 500 firms and mid-market companies improve their marketing success using his proprietary marketing processes and automated software tools. He still lives in a suburb of Minneapolis with his wife. They have two daughters and three grandchildren who all live nearby—much to their delight.


After graduating from Howe, Chuck received his B.A. degree from DePauw University in 1963 and his MBA from Indiana University's Kelley School of Business in 1965. He then served his country as a Lieutenant in the Army, before embarking on his business career as a marketing executive with General Mills, Inc., in Minneapolis. He has also been an entrepreneur, as president and CEO of two different companies. When the second company was acquired by a larger firm, he formed his current consulting group.

Through his consulting firm, Chuck has worked with over 50 clients all over the world, including Microsoft, 3M, AT&T, NCR Corp., United Health, US Bank, Wells Fargo, and Deluxe Corporation, among others. He has also conducted hundreds of marketing seminars for over 8,000 marketing executives and has served as adjunct professor of marketing in the MBA program at The University of St. Thomas in Minneapolis.

While owning and managing his consulting firm he authored over forty articles for his bylined column titled "Product Management Today", for the Bank Administration Institute's monthly newsletter. This publication had a circulation of over 3000 financial institutions and was read on a monthly basis by over 25,000 bankers. Chuck is recognized for his accomplishments in the Worldwide Edition of Who's Who for CEO's, Entrepreneurs and Professionals.

What may also be of interest to "Howe Now" readers, Chuck has recently published a book about his minister father, Dr. Merrill B McFall, who was head pastor at Irvington United Methodist Church in Indianapolis from 1958 to 1963. Many of Chuck (Bud)'s Howe classmates attended his dad's church and will remember Rev. "Mac" (his father's nickname) from their time living in the Irvington area.

The book chronicles his father's rather interesting life and his inspirational influence on many people's lives as he helped them through crises and otherwise ministered to their needs. The book is titled "The Calling—Based on True Events in the Extraordinary Life of an Extraordinary Indiana Pastor".

Interestingly, Chuck began his love of writing while taking a creative writing class at Howe. During that time, his teacher encouraged and helped hone his writing skills, eventually honoring him by selecting three of his short stories for inclusion in the "Best Writing of 1959" anthology, printed each year by the school. He also was inducted into "Quill and Scroll"—an honorary society recognizing writing achievement—during his senior year at Howe.

Ever since his time at Howe High School, Chuck has been collecting stories about his father and the many people his father helped over the span of his ministry. He finally sat down in 2016 and began writing this book that had been germinating in the recesses of his brain all those many years. The book has a web site at www.thecalling-chuckmcfall.com and is available from Amazon, Barnes and Noble, Christian Books online, 30,000 bookstores worldwide and many other internet book outlets. It is available in hard cover, paperback and e-book formats and published by Westbow Press. Chuck hopes his fellow Howe alumni have a chance to read the book, and he would welcome feedback from those of you who do so by writing your comments in the "Contact" page of the book's web site.

"Never place a period in your life where God only intended a comma".


